A licensed staff, who under the direction of the principal, will serve a selected group of students in an after-school capacity. The frequency and duration of this program will be negotiated with the principal to best serve the students and community of the school. Under contracted agreement these parameters will be:

	The essential functions of this job include, but are not limited to, the following fundamental job duties:			
1.	The scope, nature, selection process, and curriculum of this program will be under the direction of the principal and the responsibility of the instructor.			
2.	Use an agreed upon system for selection of students.			
3.	Select, prepare and coordinate curriculum and activities.			
4.	Schedule meetings in conjunction with other after-school activities.			
5.	Communicate with parents and families as needed.			
6.	Promote the program and work with other staff when directed by the principal.			
7.	Report any issues or concerns to the principal.			
8.	Follow contractual agreements in relation to time, contract hours, and meetings per week:			
	 Twenty-three (23) student contact hours with one (1) hour of preparation for a total of 24 hours. 			
	 A guideline of no more than two (2) meetings per week. 			
	• A timeframe of one to one and one half $(1 - 1\frac{1}{2})$ hours per meeting period.			
	It is recommended that a student to teacher ratio of 15:1 be followed.			
9.	Other duties as assigned.

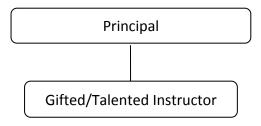
